ITS TOO LATE TO "SAVE OUR STATION" The dictionary defines "station" as a stopping place along a route of travel, such as a railroad station. Thus, Goleta **station** is already long gone, eliminated by Southern Pacific back in the 1960s when the company ceased to use the site as a loading point. "Depot" (which, incidentally, may be pronounced with either a long or short-sounding "e"), however, may refer either to the stopping place itself or to the building that is found there. Thus, Goleta depot continues to exist, we hope for many, many years to come.

GOLETA DEPOT MOVED ONCE BEFORE In "Goleta: The Good Land", Walker A. Tompkins tells us that the original Goleta depot (and station) was located south of the present site, near what is now the Welch-Ryce mortuary on Ward Drive. The station was moved, and a new, larger depot building (the present one) was constructed back in 1901, when the track was moved to its current location, as a result of the "Hood Survey".

The new route was both straighter and faster than the earlier one. According to Timothy Dunn, a UCSB history student, the change was made both possible and necessary by the new breed of locomotives - possible because the new oil burners were able to climb the steeper grades that a straighter route demanded and necessary because the new engines couldn't negociate the tight 10 degree curves of the original route.

FUNDING UPDATE The \$60,000 mark has now been passed!!! That is 67.6% of the Phase I goal. \$29,000 in cash or kind is still needed to complete Phase I which includes moving costs, building stabilization, protection from the elements and vandalism, site work and utility installations, and restoration/rehabilitation of the depot exterior.
