**FUNDING REPORT** As of April 7th, 24% of the \$100,000 needed for Phase II has been raised. Phase II covers all interior restoration and rehabilitation. \$76,000 is still needed to complete the fund-raising effort.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE Much has happened at the depot since the March issue of the Dispatch. Carpenters have made repairs to several spots on the floors in the baggage and waiting rooms and in the railroad office. Construction also has been begun on the divider wall which will convert the baggage room into the building's restrooms. This wall also serves as added structural support for upstairs rooms. The freight room is being prepared for the installation of new panelling and the northern end of the building (originally the eastern end) is being readied for the placement of new exterior siding.

On the second floor, drywall has been removed from the walls in the dining room and adjacent bedroom, to expose the original beaded, tongue and groove paneling, which will be refinished.

**DEPOT MUSEUM** Two rooms in the depot, the waiting room and railroad office, will become the museum portion of the depot building. In the office, our objective is to recreate the atmosphere of a functioning railroad station, through the use of authentic furnishings and items which would normally be found in an active railroad office. The waiting room will be restored to historic standards as well, but it will serve also as a meeting room and a display area for museum artifacts that are not suited to the railroad office.

MAJOR CONTRIBUTORS SOUGHT The depot committee is seeking major contributors to underwrite the depot museum and other Phase II construction costs. As a means of achieving this, we will be placing a special, commemorative plaque in the depot museum which will acknowledge those individuals, families or organizations that have donated \$7500 or more to the project. The unit was stationed at the marine base located where UCSB and the airport are today. The 244th was the first unit to leave for overseas duty, shipping out by way of Goleta depot in early 1943.
