DOUBLE-HEADER BARBEQUE The June 5th BBQ at Stow House was a rousing success. Attendance was around 200 again this year and several hundred dollars were raised for the depot. Thanks to the **Goleta Valley Historical Society** for their continuing support of our project.

IN-KIND DONATIONS Southern California Edison kindly deducted \$200 from their bill for the installation of electric service to the depot.

The staking of the depot's sewer line was generously donated by Waters Land Surveying Inc.

FUNDING COUNTDOWN The project has received a major contribution, totalling \$2000, from the **Raytheon Company.** Special thanks are due to **Frank Umanzio**, local Raytheon manager, and to **George Adams**, of the Depot Committee, for making this important donation possible.

As of June 7th, we are within \$73,000 of the amount needed for project completion. This amount may be in cash or in kind.

LEASING Sub-lease agreements are nearing completion for the building's first three tenants: the **Institute for American Research, Goleta Valley Chamber of Commerce,** and **Santa Barbara Audubon Society.** The Audubon Society already has signed their lease and deposited the first and last month's rent. An October 1 move-in date is planned.

Dick Sandow, sub-leasing chairman, reports that there are still approximately 360 square feet of space in the depot available for lease. Tenants must be local nonprofit organizations.
