CONSTRUCTION PLANS Watch for the following changes and additions out at the depot over the coming months: the original redwood gutters will be restored or replaced; the "GOLETA" signs will return to their proper homes on the Depot roof; the semaphore signal will be installed on the loading dock; a section of track will be laid out front by SP work crews and there will be a wig-wag and probably other equipment as well. We will also be out-fitting the waiting room and railroad office with artifacts and other memorabilia.

CHRISTMAS TREE LIGHTING In years past, when railroad stations were as numerous as windmills in rural America, it was common practice for the Southern Pacific Railroad agents and their families to place the traditional Christmas tree in the depot's second story window bay, where its lights of wonder and hope could be seen and enjoyed by travelers on passing trains.

On December 17th, we will endeavor to rekindle this bit of our local heritage, when the Christmas tree will again return to its customary place in Goleta depot's bay window. The tree will be lit every night until Christmas, so if you're in the neighborhood, drive by and enjoy, or stop off any weekday afternoon and add a personal ornament to the tree.

DEPOT PAINTING The **Institute for American Research** is pleased to announce that it has beautiful, full-color 12x19 prints of a painting of Goleta Depot by local artist **Lynn D. Sexton**, great-grandson of Goleta Valley pioneers Joseph and Lucy Foster Sexton. This is the same painting that graces the cover of Coombs' history of Goleta Depot. 200 of these prints are numbered and signed by the artist and sell for \$20; unsigned copies are \$15. Both versions are accompanied by a capsule history of the depot and a description of the art work.

The prints may be viewed and purchased at the Institute on weekdays from 1-5 p.m. or in the Depot Waiting Room on tour days. Proceeds are shared by the Depot and Institute programs.
