DEPOT DISPATCH This is the first issue on our new quarterly publication schedule. You probably noticed a few changes. One is that we are currently using first class postage. This was necessary because we need a mailing list of 200 in order to use bulk mailing. First class is a very expensive alternative, so if you know of anyone not getting the **Dispatch** who would like to, please send us their name or have them get in touch with us. Remember, there is no charge for the **Dispatch**, although we suggest a \$2 donation (tax deductible) to the Institute for American Research (300 N. Los Carneros Rd, Goleta 93117) to help defray the costs of publication and distribution.


DEPOT HISTORY We have now sold about 800 copies of **Goleta Depot:** The History of **A Rural Railroad Station.** They may be purchased at the Depot and at most local bookstores.

CONSTRUCTION Work on the building has progressed very slowly due to all of the rains that we've had this winter. Have you seen the new "GOLETA" sign which now graces the front of the building? It was built by **Ralph Moore**, painted by **Gary Coombs**, and mounted by Gary and **Gene Allen**. It really adds a lot to the look of the landmark!

We are now beginning work on the restoration of the railroad office. This was the Depot's "action-center" and it should be the show-piece of the museum when it's completed. SEMAPHORE SIGNAL The train order signal at Goleta Depot was a simple two-position station stop semaphore, like the one shown at right. The center ("caution") position was apparently never used at Goleta, and was absent from the original signal board. We hope to have our semaphore installed and working again by the end of summer.

RAILROAD ADVENTURE Our Feb. 11-12th train trip to **San Luis Obispo** was a fine success. We took a group of 18 and everyone had a great (if somewhat soggy) time. On our return ride, most were already talking about when the next trip would be and where we would go.

The answer is that a trip to **Sacramento** and the **State Railroad Museum** has been scheduled for May. We have tentatively set the trip for the weekend of either the 14th or the 21th. In either case, we would leave on Friday from the Santa Barbara station shortly after noon and return on Sunday by 5 p.m. Depot Friend **Roger Levenson**, who will accompany us, is arranging a special tour of the Railroad Museum with his friends there.

The cost will be \$180 for the first person (double occupancy) and \$150 for each additional family member. This price includes rail fares and two nights lodging.
