LIGHTS When you attend the Christmas party on Dec. 15, you will surely appreciate the fact that we now have a string of walk lights marking the once-dark corridor between the parking lot and the depot. We can thank Bob Hiestand, Ray Baird, and Gene Allen for all of their hard work in installing the lights, and the Santa Barbara Foundation and Goleta Valley Chamber of Commerce/S.B. County Bed Tax for sharing the costs of materials.

TRACK UPDATE We were very disappointed to learn that the Southern Pacific Railroad would be unable to provide the materials needed for the construction of track in front of the depot. This was an unfortunate result of the corporate merging of the S.P. and the Santa Fe, which is now in progress.

The Depot Committee has decided, nevertheless, that 1985 will be the year that the track goes in -- one way or another. As a first step, the Southern Pacific has presented us with a \$500 donation, which will be used toward the costs of track construction, estimated at \$11,800. To raise the remaining funds, we will be applying all monies from the 1985 Asphalt Regatta toward the track project.
