Goleta National Bank Sponsors "Free Rides for Dads"

"Another Steaming Summer" Is Here

An exciting summer season of live-steam miniature railroading at the museum begins Saturday, June 24, with the start of the eighth annual Another Steaming Summer, sponsored by **Toyota of Santa Barbara**. The first day's festivities will be highlighted by **Gene Allen's** 4-4-0 American, a Steaming Summer regular, built by Allen Models, Inc. of Goleta.

The event continues July 22 and Aug. 26. Hours for all three Saturdays will be 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The event will also feature handcar rides at 25¢ each (riders must be at least 48 inches tall) and continuous free showings of *Thomas The Tank Engine* videos in the museum's Gandy Dancer Theater.

Members of the Goleta Lions Club will again be here to prepare and sell tri-tip sandwiches and hot dogs, with all proceeds going to the railroad museum.

There is no charge for admission to Another Steaming Summer. Single-ride tickets on the Goleta Short Line are \$1 and 3-ride tickets \$2.50. Coupons good for 1/2 off on all train-ride tickets, are available at Toyota of Santa Barbara, 5611 Hollister Ave.

Steam Loco Class Offered

This summer, the museum is again offering a short course on *The Operation and Maintenance of a Steam Locomotive*. **Eugene Allen** will serve as instructor of the two-session class, which will utilize his 4-4-0 American for demonstration purposes.

Train Schedule Undergoes Changes Expanded Sunday and Summer Hours

Beginning May 1, several changes were made to the Goleta Short Line schedule. Trains will now operate on a set time schedule, with departures every 15 minutes. On Saturdays and Sundays, the first train will be at 1:15 p.m. and the last train at 3:45. On Wednesdays and Fridays, the first train will be at 2 p.m. and the final train of the day will depart at 3:30. During busy times or when necessary for other reasons, extra trains may be dispatched – at the discretion of the conductor.

During July and August only, the weekday schedule will be expanded, with trains running on Thursdays as well as Wednesdays and Fridays. Weekday hours also will be increased to match the weekend timetable, with departures every 15 minutes from 1:15 until 3:45.

Director Phyllis Olsen. A receptive lounge-car audience listened to Gary's narrative over the public-address system, while Phyllis greeted passengers, distributed brochures, and answered questions in the upper level of the attractive new Superliner II car.

The one-way rehearsal covered the Oxnard-to-Guadalupe area. To meet the *Coast Starlight* in Oxnard, the pair rode the *San Diegan* from Santa Barbara in the morning. Then, in the afternoon after completing the program, they were passed to Train 11, the southbound *Coast Starlight* at the meeting spot in Guadalupe, to effect their return to Santa Barbara.

The lounge car was filled throughout much of the program and the passengers proved both eager and appreciative. Both Phyllis and Gary were elated about how well the program had been received. "It's wonderful to be able to share our area's rich history, points of interest, and things to do," Gary said. Phyllis called the experience "extremely rewarding."

We anticipate that, following additional tests in June, the program will commence with presentations given at least once a week during July and August. Members who are interested in becoming a *Coast Starlight* interpretive guide are urged to contact the museum office (964-3540).

Runte Shares "Trains of Discovery"

Those attending the May 17 program at Goleta Library were treated to an informative and thoughtprovoking presentation by author and historian Alfred Runte, based on his book, *Trains of Discovery: Western Railroads and the National Parks.*

Dr. Runte's hour-long program explored the century-old relationship between the Western railroads and our national parks. He examined the significant role that the railroads played in the creation of the national parks in the late 1800s, and in their subsequent growth and development.

The presentation was profusely illustrated, with handsome depictions of both historic railroad art and rare print advertising, which colorfully promoted both the national parks and rail travel. He also discussed often passionately — contemporary issues and events, including the recent restoration of the Grand Canyon Railway and present-day Amtrak cutbacks in the West.

A Visiting Professor of History at UCSB, Alfred Runte is a noted environmental historian, public lecturer, and specialist on the national parks. Following the program, he was available to meet with attendees and to autograph copies of *Trains of Discovery*.

\$10,000 was eventually raised.

This year's event featured three teams, the Short Line Shortcutters, the Leaping Leopards, and The Lost Team, headed by Trustees **Ben Beede**, Jack Cogan, and **Bill Parker**, respectively. The teams competed to raise the most money for the museum and to earn the highest point total in a "safari" walk around scenic Lake Los Carneros.

After registration, each team was outfitted with pith helmets, a map, an "Emergency Survival Kit," and a *Safari Journal*, whose pages were completed as the teams mastered a series of six adventures during their park expedition. Midway along, teams came to the "Trading Post," where refreshments were served.

Each safari began and ended with a ride on the "Jungle Train" which carried team members from the "Last Chance Outpost" embarkation point to a festively-decorated "Bwana Junction," their final destination, where participants enjoyed a potluck luncheon.

Beede's Shortcutters and Cogan's Leopards are currently in a dead heat for the fundraising championship. Winning teams and top individual fundraisers will be announced and prizes awarded at the museum's June 21 meeting at Goleta Library. All members are encouraged to join the 7:30 p.m. get-together and help to honor all Safari participants for their valuable service to the museum.

Museum Receives Collections Gifts

Ticket sales reached 512, rivalling last year's total. Volunteers Upgrading Model Exhibit

Gene Rantanen has installed an electronic detector in the Model-Railroad Exhibit room, which puts the trains in motion when a visitor enters the exhibition area. This is a first step toward making the museum's most popular exhibit open during all museum hours. Efforts are now underway to increase layout security so that the room may be shared with visitors without the need for docent supervision.

It is estimated that, when the current work is completed, at least 3,000 more visitors will be able to enjoy the exhibit annually.

Display Sign Now Greets Visitors

There has long been a need for a welcome sign that will provide arriving visitors with information about the museum. That need has now been met with a new display-case sign that greets visitors as they start down the sidewalk from the parking lot.

The sign measures 3x3 feet and is mounted on wood posts. It displays, under Plexiglas, both permanent and changing information, including museum hours, today's activities and schedule, visitor advisories, and coming events. The commerciallymanufactured sign was installed by **Eugene Allen**.

Member Discounts Clarified

There has been some confusion regarding member discounts on Goleta Short Line ticket purchases. The 25¢ discount applies to every ticket purchased by the member, regardless of whether the ticket is used by the member or by an accompanying friend or family member. The discount may be used for multi-ride tickets, for birthday and special occasion "Party-Pack" purchases, and during special events.

A valid membership card must be shown to receive the ticket discount, as well as for discounts in the museum's Trackside Shop. If you've lost your card, a replacement may be obtained by contacting the museum office (964-3540).

Museum Reps Observe CSRM Program

To assist in the design of the *Coast Starlight* interpretive program, representatives from our museum made an April 23-27 trip to Sacramento and Reno to observe the parallel program conducted by the Calif. State Railroad Museum docents on the *Calif. Zephyr*. Museum Director Gary Coombs was accompanied on the trip by Docent **Bruce Morden**, **Andrea Morden**, Trustee **Robert Sponsel**, and **Patricia Chidlaw**.

A great deal was learned from observing this fine and long-established program. Interpretive-program chairman **Robert Dawson** and guides **Bill and Jacquie Carr** were especially helpful and gracious during the visit. Sadly, although the CSRM program will continue, it is being adversely impacted by Amtrak's rollback of *Zephyr* operations to a four-days-a-week schedule starting June 13.

The museum team spent an extra night in Reno to make a side trip to Carson City to visit the Nevada State Museum and Nevada Railroad Museum. The group was escorted on a day-long, personal "insiders" tour by **Robert Nylen**, Curator of History at the Nevada museums, and a friend and colleague of Gary's. The Nevada museums generously rented a van to transport the group roundtrip from Reno and throughout the day in Carson City, which included

In the last *Depot Dispatch*, readers were introduced to *On_Trackl*, an educational program for local youth now being developed by museum staff and educators from the **Goleta Union School District**.

One of several new activities and resources added to $On_Track!$ this year was a list of 73 railroad words, which teachers can use for classroom spelling or other applications. Several variants of the list have been prepared, including an English/Spanish version and another with the words indexed by grade level. All of these various forms of the list are being made available to teachers through the school district's Instructional Materials Center.
