#### Candy Cane Train Starts Nov. 24

On Friday, Nov. 24, the museum's miniature train will be transformed into the Candy Cane Train, specially decorated for the holiday season.

The Candy Cane Train will carry passengers daily through Dec. 24, except Mondays and Tuesdays, when the museum is closed. Hours of operation will be 2 'til

3:30 p.m. (1 to 4 on Saturdays and Sundays).

Tickets for the Candy Cane Train are \$1.75 each for children or adults, which includes a train ride, holiday treat and favors. A three-ride ticket will also be available for \$3.00. All tickets will be sold at the museum during event hours.

#### Sweetheart Special Departs Feb. 10

The weekend of Feb. 10-11 has been set aside for the 1996 edition of the Sweetheart Special, the museum's popular Valentine's-theme train trip to San Diego, first offered back in 1989.

The entire custom-class car on Amtrak's San Diegan has been reserved roundtrip for the museum group. Plenty of games, prizes, festive decorations, and

other fun things are planned enroute.

The group will stay at the Vacation Inn Old Town State Historic Park. Shops, museums & over 34 restaurants are steps away. A city trolley is convenient to further explore San Diegos many fine attractions.

Costs are \$149 per person (double occupancy; \$169 single), which includes Saturday night accommodations, first-class rail fare, and transfers in San Diego.
