Easter Bunny Express Here April 3

Support Rabbit Transit! It's time for another fun-filled *Easter Bunny Express* at the railroad museum. The museum's ever-popular springtime event will be celebrating its 18th anniversary on Saturday, April 3.

Those attending this year's event will be treated to a hutchful of happy diversions, each listed as a "station" on the super-sized, egg-shaped tickets. Station stops include visits to Wabbit-Twacks Station (to ride one of the decorated trains on a one-third-mile-long course); Easter-Bunnyville (to meet the Easter Bunny, where children will also receive an egg surprise); Jack-Rabbit Junction (to enter a prize drawing); and What's Up Dock (to collect another event souvenir).

The ticket cost is \$4 per person, adult or child. For those who will not be riding the miniature trains, the cost is just \$3.

This year, we'll again have two trains, the *EBX Thunderbunny* and the *Lop-Ear Local*, and two separate one-third-milelong routes. Ticketholders can choose which train to ride. Or, they can ride both trains for just \$2 more.

Event hours are 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. There will be drawings held at *Jack Rab-bit Junction* every hour — at 12 noon, 1:00, 2:00, 3:00, and 3:45 p.m.

Tickets are available in advance at the museum. They will also be sold during the event until 3:30 p.m.

For those who would like to have lunch or an afternoon snack, mu-

Museum To Help Celebrate "National Train Day" At Three Venues

Besides Amtrak, the railroad museum may be just about the only organization in the country that will be celebrating *National Train Day* in three different locations — at Los Angeles Union Station, at the Santa Barbara Amtrak Station, and aboard the Los Angeles-to-Seattle *Coast Starlight* train.

The 3rd annual *National Train Day* will be held Saturday, May 8. The event celebrates America's love for trains and features family-friendly activities at venues across the country. Attractions will include musical entertainment, rolling-stock tours, exhibits, VIP appearances, drawings for trips and other prizes, and lots of souvenir giveaways.

Our museum has been selected to be an exhibitor at the Los Angeles venue — one of four major *National Train Day* locations, along with Washington, D.C., Chicago, and Philadelphia. Los Angeles Union Station is at 800 N. Alameda Street. Event hours are 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Two smaller *National Train Day* events are being planned in other California cities — one in Santa Barbara and the other in Salinas. Our museum is also taking part in the Santa Barbara event, partnering with CoastalRail-Now. The local event will run from 9 a.m. to 12 noon at the Santa Barbara Amtrak Station, 209 State Street, and will feature a roundtrip train ride from Santa Barbara to Carpinteria, a press conference with elected officials, a magician, refreshments, and a cookie-decorating contest.

Aboard Amtrak's long-distance *Coast Starlight* train, also on *National Train Day,* Trails & Rails guides from the museum will be presenting a live program to train passengers on local history, points-of-things, things-to-do, and the natural history along the railroad route between Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo.

We hope that many museum members will participate in some of these *National Train Day* festivities. When you do, please say hello to the volunteers and staff members who are manning the museum table or giving a presentation.

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Museum Greets New Guides

The rest of their training will include additional individual study followed by a series of training trips aboard Amtrak's Coast Starlight trains - the latter under the supervision of the museum's senior guide-volunteers.

The Trails & Rails program is offered four days a week to Coast Starlight passengers between the station stops of Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo. It includes a live presentation in which the guides share information, anecdotes, photographs, and other materials related to area history, local sights, natural history, and things-to-do along the train's route. During the summer months, one guide trip each week is extended north to the Bay Area.



In Memoriam: John Marshall Starr

We mourn the passing of John Marshall Starr, a singular member of the museum family. John Starr was one of the charter members of the "Friends



of Goleta Depot," whose names appeared in the first two issues of the *Depot Dispatch* newsletter back in June, 1981.

John became a museum volunteer in 1985, serving as one of a handful of early "docents," who gave guided tours of the historical landmark. Later, he would become a volunteer "agent," interpreting the building for museum visitors. Of his museum docent work, John said that he most enjoyed interacting with his fellow volunteers and "discovering all the details that bring history alive."

John's lifelong love of trains could be traced back to his grandfather, an engineer with the Burlington Northern for 46 years.

John's father worked for the Great Northern Ry. When John was born, his dad was out on the rails, trying to get from Minot, North Dakota to the fam-

ily home in Devils Lake in time for the blessed event, June 16, 1941.

John served on the museum's board of trustees for a number of years and supported the organization

supported the organization financially in many ways, including annual and endowment gifts, as a charter "Milepost 100" member, and through frequent participation in annual Spring Fundraisers. In 1991, he even organized his own fundraiser – pledging \$1,200 personally and challenging other members – and the community at large – to match his gift, eventually raising \$3,000 for the museum.

John distinguished himself in many other ways around the museum. For 27 years, he was *Depot Day*'s indispensable "auction agent," the man who kept the books and distributed the goods for the annual Silent Auction. In 1989, when his work demanded that he move to Ridgecrest, John continued to help with special

events at the museum, despite the 400-plus-mile roundtrip drive. He even kept on as a regular volunteer, staffing at the museum every fifth Saturday for 20 years, another four trips to Goleta every year.

John will be deeply missed for his wise counsel, his gentle wit, his thirst for knowledge, and his unwavering friendship and loyalty. John Starr died Dec. 25, 2009 at the Ridgecrest Regional Hospital.

More Overland Trail Trips Planned

The museum has been working with the owners of the *Overland Trail* rail car to provide vintage rail travel at an affordable price to museum members as well as the general public in the greater Santa Barbara area.

Seats at \$55 each are still available for a Father's Day trip on Sunday, June 20. Passengers can board in either Santa Barbara or Goleta. The train is scheduled to depart Santa Barbara at 10:15 (10:27 for Goleta), arriving in San Luis Obispo at 12:45. The return begins at 2 p.m., arriving in Goleta at 4:16, Santa Barbara at 4:31. Passengers are responsible for their own lunches. To make reservations for the Father's Day trip, call the museum 805/964-3540.

An exclusive museum-only trip, set for May 1 and featuring a gourmet box lunch prepared and served by Santa Barbara executive chef Vincent Vanhecke, was quickly filled to capacity. We are currently planning a similar trip for later in the year. Call us if you would like to be on the waiting list for this late 2010 trip.
