Depot Day Event Marks 28th Year on Sept. 26

The 28th annual "*Depot Day*" will be held on Sunday, Sept. 26, at the museum. Hours for the event are 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Depot Day is the museum's oldest community event, celebrating the saving of the landmark building, its colorful history, and its significance as a community treasure. Goleta Depot is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and the California Register of Histori-

cal Resources. It is also a Santa Barbara County Historical Landmark.

Depot Day is the only day each year when rides are offered on three different types of rail vehicles, with **Bob Mahan's** inspection "speeder," formerly of the Ventura County Railway, joining our handcar and Goleta Short Line miniature trains on the museum's tracks.

There will be two trains operating simultaneously on two different tracks, including a two-thirds-mile

track terminating at the Main Station, and a one-third-mile route served by the West-side Station. This means there will be plenty of opportunities for trains to meet and riders on passing trains to greet one

another with a wave of the hand.

For only \$3, you can purchase a wrist-band that is good for unlimited trips on all *Depot Day* rides. (Train and speeder riders must be at least 34 inches tall; handcar riders must be 48 inches or

more.)



Depot Day is also an important fundraiser for the museum, and
