
At the online store you will find a selection of store merchandise, with an emphasis on Goleta Depot gifts & souvenirs, our local history publications, and Goleta lemon labels.


Several new and returning products are also being featured at the online store. All of these can be found in articles throughout this newsletter issue.

"Stow House" Booklet Back In Print

In 1986, the museum's assistant director, **Phyllis Olsen**, wrote a history of Stow House, our neighbor to the east. It was published that year in a book entitled *Those Were The Days: Landmarks Of Old Goleta*. Phyllis' Stow House essay was so popular that it was later reprinted as a booklet. The booklet has been out of print for several years.



Goleta Valley Beautiful Preservation Award Received

Goleta Valley Beautiful's annual "historic preservation" award has been given to Goleta Depot. The presentation was made during the organization's 37th annual awards ceremony on May 1. Board President Noel Langle accepted the award on behalf of the Board of Trustees.

Previously, our organization received two "Goleta Pride" awards, which were bestowed by then-named Goleta Beautiful, the Goleta Valley Chamber of Commerce, and the Goleta Rotary clubs. In 1997, Museum Director Gary Coombs received the award; three years later, the South Coast Railroad Museum, itself, received a Goleta Pride award.

The association between Goleta Depot and Goleta Valley Beautiful is a long one. Indeed, the campaign to save the landmark building began as a core Goleta Beautiful project. Back in 1981-82, when the Goleta Depot Project was in full swing, Goleta Beautiful gave regular "Depot Friend Of The Month" awards to a long list of volunteers, community organizations and businesses, and financial contributors who collectively led the way in the campaign's eventual success.

Newsletter Archive Ready On CD

The first 30 years of the *Depot Dispatch* newsletter, from 1981 through 2010, are now available on CD through the Trackside Shop, both online and at the museum. All 136 issues, spanning 474 pages, are contained in a single digital file, which may be viewed using Adobe's free Acrobat Reader or an equivalent program. Included on the

CD are all of the photographs and other illustrations contained in the original printed newsletter. Many images are in full color. The first 21 issues feature the original goldenrod color of those early printed copies. That color was chosen to try and replicate the depot's "Colonial Yellow" exterior. The paper changed to white when photo use became more common.

The CD contains two versions of the newsletter file. A smaller version is for ease of use; the larger file provides enhanced readability and image quality. Both files are fully searchable, which makes them perfect for finding names or recovering bits of information.

The CD will be of special interest to anyone who is saving the printed newsletters, who has been a museum member for a number of years, or who have an interest in local-railroad history or Goleta history. The cost is only \$9.95 plus tax.




