Goleta Railroad Days and Depot Day, two of the museum's biggest and most important events, are being combined this year into one two-day Railroad Days event. Both of the museum's diesel locomotives, No 1316 and No. 2655, will also see heavy service hauling passengers both Saturday and Sunday.

Running two trains at the same time is always a lot of fun for passengers and

crews, alike, with plenty of opportunities for trains to meet and for riders on the passing trains to greet one another with a friendly wave of the hand.

There will be rides on the museum handcar both days. **Noel Langle** and **Bruce Morden** will share the volunteer duties, keeping the handcar running smoothly and safely.

Sunday only, **Bob Mahan** will be on hand to give rides on his Fairmont inspection car. Formerly used on the **Ventura Railway**, Bob's speeder has

been a *Depot Day* mainstay for over a quarter-century, since 1985!

For the safety of our event guests, the museum's usual minimum-height require-

ments will be in effect: 34 inches for the train ride; 48 inches for the handcar.

three main local organizations serving model train and antique toy train enthusiasts.

There will be modeling demonstrations and plenty of operating displays, as well as some static ones – representing all popular gauges and scales – from pocket-sized "Z" scale (1:220) to large-scale garden railways.

Try your hand at the "Switching Puzzle," which challenges young and old to move a train successfully from one spot to another in a simulated rail yard. See if you can solve the puzzle.

There will also be a trainthemed Story Time each day from 1 until 2:30 p.m., led on Saturday by Children's Librarian Judy Savage, from Goleta Public Library, and by Kathy Halloran on Sunday.

Other Railroad Days partner organizations include Amtrak, Friends of the Santa Maria Valley Railroad, Union Pacific Railroad, Coast Rail Now, Central Coast Railroad Festival, and Coast Starlight Communities Network. Most of these will have a booth, with representatives available to answer questions, distribute literature, and share information with event-goers.

We'll be opening the museum's Gandy Dancer Theater for *Railroad Days*. Train-theme documentaries and Thomas The Tank Engine videos for the kids will be screened throughout the event.

The museum's jukebox will be playing all of your favorite railroad tunes during Railroad Days.

Food For Hungry Event-Goers

Depot Day Traditions

Depot Day is the day set aside each year to celebrate the saving of Goleta's landmark railroad building, its colorful story and its significance as an architectural and historical treasure. Goleta Depot is listed on the **National Register of Historic Places** and the **California Register of Historical Resources**. It is also Santa Barbara County Historical Landmark No. 22.

Besides the silent auction and inspection-car rides, there are other *Depot Day* traditions that you will find alive and well on Sept. 18. These include an afternoon open house of the second-floor agent's quarters. *Depot Day* will again be the only day during 2011 in which you can visit this area where Goleta Depot's agents and their families lived. The space has been refurnished to re-create that home atmosphere.
