Hop Aboard Easter Bunny Express On April 7


The long wait is over. Another *Easter Bunny Express* is just a few days away. This will be the 20th annual event, which takes place Saturday, April 7, at the railroad museum. Hours are 11 a.m. 'til 4 pm.

As always, there will be lots of fun family activities for those who attend. Each activity will be shown as a "station" on the colorful, oversized, egg-shaped tickets. These station stops include visits to **Wabbit-Twacks Station** – to take a six-minute ride on one of the festively decorated trains – **Easter-Bunnyville** – to meet the Easter Bunny, where children will also receive an egg surprise – **Jack-Rabbit Junction** – to enter a prize drawing – and **What's Up Dock** – to collect another *Easter Bunny Express*

souvenir. There will be

two trains again this year, the *EBX Thunderbunny* and the *Lop-Ear Local*, each running on its own one-thirdmile-long route. Ticketholders will be able to choose which train to ride. Or, they can ride <u>both</u> trains for an extra \$2.

For those who care to have lunch or an afternoon snack, museum volunteers will be serving Depot Dogs, smoked-sausage sandwiches, snacks, and refreshments throughout the day.

The ticket cost is \$4 per person, adult or child. For those who will not be riding the miniature trains, the cost is just \$3. Tickets are available in advance at the museum, or make your purchase through the Online

Store and receive a discount on every ticket that you buy! Tickets will also be sold during the event until 3:30 p.m.

The 2012 Easter Bunny Express promises to be another "hare-raising eggsperience" for the whole family. Hop aboard! (rain date: April 14).

The museum will be closed on Easter Sunday, April 8.

Volunteer guides from the museum's Trails & Rails Program will again join in staffing *National Train Day* at Los Angeles Union Station on Saturday, May 7. Hours are 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

This will be the 5th annual *National Train Day* event, which celebrates America's love of trains. The event will feature a long list of family-friendly activities and attractions including rolling-stock tours, "Kids Depot" fun area, musical entertainment, model train displays, special exhibits, drawings for trips and other prizes, and lots of souvenir giveaways.

Besides Los Angeles, four other cities will feature major *National Train Day* festivities – New York, Washington, D.C., Chicago, and Philadelphia. Los Angeles Union Station is at 800 N. Alameda Street.

Museum Honors Eugene Allen

Jan. 28 was a very special day at the museum. We dedicated the Goleta Short Line miniature railroad that afternoon, honoring the man most responsible for its existence, **Gene Allen**.

Museum Director **Gary Coombs** and Board of Trustees President **Noel Langle** spoke, each citing many of the museum features and milestones for which Gene Allen was responsible. Langle and Asst. Director **Phyllis Olsen** unveiled a permanent stainless steel plaque (see right) to commemorate the occasion.

Regrettably, Gene was not able to attend the event due to illness, but a number of family members were there. Gene's daughter, **Christine Allen**, said a few words on behalf of the family to the audience of about 40 members and well-wishers. Among those attending were a number of Gene's longtime friends, including **Ralph Moore, George Potter**, and **Ed Winnewisser**.

The tribute also included a video presentation that shared images of Gene and his involvement in museum activities and affairs, from the earliest days of the Goleta Depot Project to the present.

Among the most significant: Gene was a member of the Goleta Depot Committee throughout its existence (chair, 1983-87) and headed the "Restoration & Review" sub-committee; he took on responsibility for the restoration of Goleta Depot's Freight Office facade; and he served for many years on the Board of Trustees, including terms as vice-president.

New Roof Is Next Major Step In Protection Of Landmark Building

Goleta Depot will soon have a brand new roof! The work that will commence in the coming weeks is being made possible by a \$16,000 grant from the **City of Goleta** and a supplemental grant of \$4,800 from the **Santa Barbara Foundation**.

The existing roof was installed back in 1982, as part of the work to restore and revitalize Goleta Depot. There has been much wear and tear to the roof over that 30-year span.

New Guide-In-Training Join "Trails & Rails"

The 2012 training for the Trails & Rails Program began on Saturday, Feb. 18. Attending the day-long session were nine new guide prospects and 15 of our continuing guides, who must complete the training every two years. Eight of the nine guide-prospects subsequently applied to join the program: **Daniel Ahern**, **Dana Andersen**,**Nita Bill**, **Karl Bretz**, **Debbie Fedaleo**, **Judy Piper**, **Becky Reid**, and **Sharon Rose**.

Much of the training was handled by **Susan Scott**, Lecturer in the **Dept. of Recreation, Park and Tourism Sciences** at **Texas A & M University**. The session was also an opportunity for attendees to meet **Hale Sargent**, the new Interpretive Specialist with the National Park Service's **Juan Bautista de Anza National Historic Trail**, which partners with the railroad museum and **Amtrak** in the Trails & Rails Program. **Museum Director Gary Coombs** introduced attendees to the 2012 Trails & Rails Standard Operating Procedures.

Additional training will include individual study followed by training trips aboard Amtrak's *Coast Starlight* trains – under the supervision of senior museum guides.

The Trails & Rails program is offered four days a week to *Coast Starlight* passengers between Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo. It includes a live presentations about area history, local sights, natural history, and things-to-do along the train's route. During the summer months, one guide trip each week is extended north to San Jose.
