Railroad Days Coming August 17-18 Weekend

Huge Sale Will Be Event Highlight

The 5th annual Goleta Railroad Days will be held the weekend of Aug. 17-18. This year's event promises to be quite a bit different from its predecessors. There will be plenty of rides again, as usual, but the real focus for 2013 will be on the public sale of a large quantity of items that the museum has received recently as donations from a number of families and estates.

The items to be sold include something for every rail fan and train enthusiast, regardless of age. There will be lots of model railroad supplies, new and used books, clothing, videos, posters, and a vast array of collectibles and railroadiana. The model railroad collection alone includes several brass locomotives, complete trainsets, building and other kits in their original boxes, and plenty more.

Event hours are from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. both Saturday and Sunday. The miniature-train ride will run from 1 to 4 p.m. both days. Free handcar rides will be offered on Saturday, also from 1 to 4. Train riders must meet the 34-inch minimum-height requirement. For handcar riders, there is a 48-inch minimum.

A special added attraction: author and historian **Henry Bender** will be in attendance on Saturday afternoon to autograph copies of his new book, Southern Pacific Lines Standard-Design Depots.

There is no admission charge for this year's event. Don't miss out. Everyone is likely to come away with some real bargains. All proceeds benefit the museum, too. There has never

too! All passengers will be able to ride both upstairs in the Vista Dome and downstairs in the dining salon.

If musical entertainment is more to your liking, hop aboard the vintage railcar, *Overland Trail*, also on July 13. In the afternoon, during the return from San Luis Obispo, Paull E. Rubin (dobro, slide guitar & vocals) & Robert Perales (vocals, ukelele & guitar) will be performing music from the Great American Songbook, train songs and modern favorites.

Or, ride the historic Santa Fe club-lounge, *Acoma*, on Saturday, July 20. A volunteer guide from the museum will be aboard to point out local sights and points-of-interest during the trip.

All three day trips travel to San Luis Obispo along our beautiful Central Coast. During the trip, take in the breathtaking Gaviota Coast, the legendary surfing beaches of the Hollister and Bixby ranches, Point Conception, the massive launch sites of Vandenberg AFB, the vineyards of the Edna Valley, state and county beach parks, a variety of wildlife and botanical wonders, and a lot more.

Passengers may board in either Santa Barbara or Goleta. Travel times are: Depart Santa Barbara (SB) at 10:22 a.m. (Goleta 10:34). Arrive San Luis Obispo (SLO) at 1:00 p.m. Depart SLO at 1:55 p.m. Arrive SB at 4:32 p.m. (Goleta 4:17).

Complimentary soft drinks, coffee, and light snacks are included. Passengers are responsible for any additional food. Passengers are welcome to bring a picnic lunch and favorite vintage to enjoy as we travel.

The second edition includes eight new chapters, which pick up where the original book left off – with the 1982 reopening of the landmark building and the beginning of its new and different life as home for a museum and three local nonprofit organizations.

A draft of the new book is now ready and is being distributed to colleagues and others who will be reviewing, editing and providing comments on

the draft in preparation for the release of the completed second edition. Since many others have placed orders and have been waiting patiently to receive their copies of the finished book, the draft version is also being made available to everyone at this time.


