Easter Bunny Express Arrives April 19



The coming of Spring means another wonderful Easter Bunny Express is just around the corner. The 22nd annual event will be held

Saturday, April 19, from 11 a.m. to 4 pm.

Lots of fun activities await those holding the colorful, oversized, egg-shaped souvenir tickets. Each event activity is listed on the ticket as a "station." These station stops include:

*Wabbit-Twacks Station — where you'll take a six-minute ride on one of the festively-decorated trains —

*Easter-Bunnyville – to meet the Easter Bunny, where children will receive an egg-filled surprise and parents will have a great chance for photos –

*Jack-Rabbit Junction – to enter a drawing for some super prizes, including dozens of cuddly stuffed animals and new plants for your garden (The drawings will held every hour, at 12 noon, 1:00, 2:00, 3:00, and 3:45.) —

and

*What's Up Dock – to collect another Easter Bunny Express souvenir.

Ticketholders can choose between two train rides. Each train will operate on its own 1/3-milelong route, the *EBX Thunderbunny* and the *Lop-Ear Local*. Or, ride both trains for just \$2 more (34-in. minimum-height requirement)

For those who would like to have lunch or an afternoon snack, museum volunteers will be serving Depot Dogs, smokedsausage sandwiches, snacks, and cold beverages throughout the day.

Tickets are \$4 per person, adult or child. For those who

will not be riding the

miniature trains, the cost is just \$3. Tickets are available in advance at the museum, or make your purchase through the Online Store and receive a discount on every ticket! Tickets will also be sold at the event until 3:30 p.m.

Museum Webpage Urges Train Use

We've added a new page to the museum website. "Trains For A Green Planet" represents our modest attempt to help inform the public about the environmental benefits of travel and transport by rail. You can visit the new page at: http://goletadepot.org/trains_green.php

Whether for passenger travel or hauling freight, trains have proven to be a highly efficient form of transportation. The result can be significant fuel savings and lower greenhouse-gas emissions.

At the museum, we are also working to save energy and reduce carbon-dioxide emissions by moving toward a fixed schedule of departures for the miniature-train ride. This method is gradually replacing the on-demand ride scheme that we've used since rides began at the museum back in the 1980s. Besides more accurately reflecting the way full-scale passenger rail systems operate, this new approach means lower engine hours, less fuel consumption, and more passengers & fewer empty seats per train trip.

Depot Book Sponsors Sought

The new digital edition of the book on the history of Goleta Depot is almost ready! One of the last remaining steps is to finalize the list of the book's sponsors.

If you've seen a draft copy of the book, you know that the acknowledgment of sponsors will be prominently placed at the front, filling the entire page facing the main title. Everyone who has sponsored the book project with a financial contribution will be listed there. This list of names will be similar to the donors list that appeared in the original depot book. That 1982 list is also being included in the new edition, on page 255. One difference is that the new list will be tiered, with the names of those contributing larger amounts appearing first. There will be three tiers of support: (1) \$250 or more; (2) \$100-\$249; and (3) \$50-\$99. All donors of \$50 or more will be acknowledged in the list.
