Easter Bunny Express Coming April 4

The *Easter Bunny Express* has become an essential rite of spring for many families on the South Coast. This year marks the 23rd celebration of this unique family event held annually at the railroad museum. It will be Saturday, April 4, from 11 a.m. until 4 pm.

The colorful, oversized, egg-shaped souvenir tickets have become an event trademark. The tickets are also a promise that plenty of fun activities await. Each activity is listed on the ticket as a "station." These station stops include:

- **Wabbit-Twacks Station* where you'll take a six-minute ride on one of the festively-decorated trains —
- *Easter-Bunnyville to meet the Easter Bunny, where children each receive an egg-filled surprise while parents take advantage of this great opportunity for photos —
- *Jack-Rabbit Junction to enter a drawing for some great prizes, including a large selection of adorable stuffed animals and lots of new plants for the garden (The drawings will held every hour, at 12 noon, 1:00, 2:00, 3:00, and 3:45.) — and

*What's Up Dock – to collect another Easter Bunny Express souvenir.

Ticketholders have their choice of two train rides, either the *EBX Thunderbunny* or the *Lop-Ear Local*. Each train will operate on its own 1/3-mile-long route, Or, ride <u>both</u> trains for just \$2 more (The museum's standard 34-in. minimumheight safety requirement applies to all train riders.)

For those wishing to have lunch or an afternoon snack, **Judy Connors** and her volunteer crew will be serving Depot Dogs, smokedsausage sandwiches, snacks, and cold beverages throughout the day.

Easter Bunny Exress tickets are \$4 per person, adult or child. For those who will not be riding the miniature trains, the cost is just \$3. Tickets are available in advance at the museum, or you may make your purchase through the online store (see below) and receive a discount on every ticket! Tickets will also be sold during the event until 3:30 p.m.


The 2015 edition of the *Easter Bunny Express* is certain to be another "hare-raising egg-sperience" for the whole family. Hop aboard!

"Train Sampler" Rail Trip Slated For April 18

The museum is organizing a special train-ride day-trip for Sat., April 18. The destination is Pismo Beach/Grover Beach and we'll be riding Amtrak's *Pacific Surfliner* trains.

We're putting this trip together as a "Train-Ride Sampler," designed especially for families or others wishing to enjoy a short train-ride experience. So that just about anyone can participate, we've set the fares lower than Amtrak itself charges for the same trip: only \$39.95 for ages 16 thru adult; \$29.95 for children ages 2 thru 15.

All passengers will assemble and board at the Goleta Amtrak Station (25 So La Patera Lane). Scheduled train times are as follows: Depart Goleta at 10:34 a.m, Arrive Grover Beach station, 12:35 p.m., Depart 2:15 p.m.; Arrive back in Goleta at 4:17 p.m.

Our train will travel along the Pacific Coast for much of the way, giving passengers the chance to experience some of the spectacular views for which this beautiful route is world famous. That includes the majestic Gaviota Coast, Santa Barbara Channel Islands, abundant wildlife and flora, the Hollister Ranch, Point Conception, Vandenberg Air Force Base, a number of state and county beach parks, and a lot more.

Museum Director Gary Coombs and Trails & Rails Senior Guide Ed Leska will be your escorts for this trip. Ed

and Gary will be ready to answer your questions and will share anecdotes, local history, points of interest, and fun facts along the way.



Group members will have about one hour and 40 minutes at our destination, to enjoy lunch at one of the many restaurants within an easy walk from the station; or pack a picnic lunch to take to Pismo State Beach, directly across from the Amtrak station. Food items will also be available for purchase during the trip in the train's Sea View Cafe & Lounge.

37 Enlist To Become Trails & Rails Guides in Santa Barbara, San Jose

The museum is having its most successful year recruiting new volunteers in the history of the organization's long association with the *Trails & Rails* program. In separate training sessions held on Jan. 24 and Feb. 28, we were able to sign up 23 new guide-prospects in the greater Santa Barbara area and another 14 for the new San Jose-based portion of the program.

The museum's *Trails & Rails* guides provide free educational programs and other interpretive services for passengers aboard Amtrak's *Coast Starlight* trains. They talk about regional history, points of interest, local sights, and the natural history along the train route, sharing brochures, images, and other illustrative materials with passengers.

New guide-prospects undergo extensive training, much of it conducted onboard the *Coast Starlight*, before they can advance to full guide status. In a typical year, many of those who apply do not successfully complete the training.

In 2015, program presentations aboard the trains will begin Friday, May 15 and continue until Sept. 6. The next cycle of recruitment and training of new volunteers will start at the end of this year.

Trails & Rails is a collaborative program of the **National Park Service** and **Amtrak**. From Santa Barbara to San Jose, these two national partners are joined in the effort by the **South Coast Railroad Museum** and the **Anza National Historic Trail**.

Ride Vintage Rail On June 20

The museum's next vintage rail trip will be Sat., June 20. Our museum is partnering with the **San Luis Obispo Railroad Museum** for this trip. We hope that it's the first of many collaborations between the two organizations.

A choice of two historic cars is available for this trip, Overland Trail or Pacific Trail. The museum has used Overland Trail, a Southern Pacific clublounge, many times over the years. This will be our first trip with Pacific Trail, however. This long-distance chair car was built by the Pullman-Standard Co. and delivered to the Union Pacific Railroad in 1950. The car served on famous Union Pacific trains like the City of Los Angeles (you may remember that Lucy, Rickie, Ethel and Fred returned home from California aboard the City of Los Angeles!). Both cars are owned by **Bill** and Debbie Hatrick of Santa Ana.

Tickets are \$69 for passage aboard *Pacific Trail* (\$49 for ages 2-15) and \$79 (no child fare for *Overland Trail*. These prices include a discount when the purchase is made through the museum's online store at: **goletadepot.org/ride**

Passengers for this trip will be able to board in Santa Barbara or Goleta. All trips depart the South Coast stations at about 10:30 a.m., arriving in San Luis Obispo for a brief stopover at about 1 p.m. The train will arrive back home at about 4:30 p.m.

Replica Station Signboards Receive Makeover

Goleta Depot now sports three newly painted "GOLETA" station signboards. These aren't the original Southern Pacific signs, which first graced the building's eaves when the depot was new, back in the early 1900s. Those precious relics are protected from the elements and preserved inside the landmark structure.

The freshly painted signs are much younger, but are still old enough to need the attention they've just received. These signs have graced the depot exterior since 1982-83, when the building was reopened at its new Lake Los Carneros Park home. Modeled after the S.P. originals, these signboards were fashioned by carpenter **Ralph Moore**, with lettering by **Gary Coombs**, who would shortly become director of a new railroad museum here. The paint and lettering of the replica signs were touched up in 2001. This is the first time, however, that they have received a comprehensive makeover by a professional sign painter.

The sign work and reinstallation was carried out by **Paul Musgrove**, who even lined up the contributors for the project. Donations were received from **Steve Randolph, Roger Drue**, and three others.
